

## Idaho Supreme Court (ISC) Funding



1. Providers serving the ISC population will require approval from ISC and will contract with BPA Health as a part of the provider network. Approved providers who have a contract with BPA Health will be linked to the ISC funding in Web Interface Treatment System (WITS).
2. Provider will submit claims to and receive reimbursements from ISC.
3. Provider will only bill for services authorized and listed on the ISC SUD Rate Matrix.
4. Provider agrees to meet requirements of this specialty network.
5. Provider will ensure treatment includes a cognitive program that addresses criminogenic thinking with a substance abuse component that meets the evidence-based guidelines established by the Provider Oversight Committee.
6. Provider agrees to formally train staff on interpretation of the LSI-R and develop individualized service plans and structure group placement using information obtained from criminogenic risk/needs assessments.
7. Provider agrees to base the frequency of drug testing on LSI-R scores. High- and Moderate-risk offenders must be drug tested two times per week in coordination with probation, treatment, and, if applicable, problem solving courts. Low-risk offender drug testing frequency is at the discretion of the provider.
8. Provider will provide consistent and regular feedback communication with probation officers, and, if applicable, court coordinators to include progress reports monthly or more frequently based on acuity.
9. Provider commits to conducting the GAIN assessment within 10 working days of the referral.
10. Provider will meet with clients for case management a minimum of one time per month.
11. Term. Provider agrees that this Amendment's Term shall apply consistent with the term of the current Agreement. The provider or BPA Health may terminate this addendum at any time in writing without terminating the provider contract in its entirety.
